Our Mission is to work for authentic acceptance and inclusion of all people living with disabilities into the full life of the Southern California Nevada Conference, UCC, through advocacy and education.

The SCNC Conference Accessibility Team (CAT) started in 2018. The objective is to assist all churches and settings to work toward and obtain the Accessible to All (A2A) designation of the UCC's Disabilities Ministries Board. Earning this designation means reviewing your facilities, programs and attitudes to purposely make sure persons living with any disability (physical, emotional, mental, etc.) is treated with value and dignity. They are not only welcome into the setting but also included in every aspect of church life. People living with disabilities are treated as the children of God they are.
